PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

I hope everyone had a fun and relaxing summer and I'd like to welcome everyone back to school! As you know, this is my second year at Hill Crest Community School and I'm very excited for another great school year. It's hard to believe that September is already over but the school year has been off to an excellent start! Both staff and students are working hard and I'm very impressed with how well everyone is working together to create a safe and caring learning environment. The staff at Hill Crest are amazing and we're very lucky to have them in the lives of our students. You, as parents send us keen and excited children every day and the staff couldn't ask for better parents to work with.

Last year I made a conscious effort to clearly communicate school happenings with the community because I strongly believe it's important that the school and community are on the same page regarding our students. Therefore, I want to outline our school goals for the 2017-2018 school year which can also be found in our Education Plan. After consulting with parents, students, and staff and analyzing various types of school data (PAT, CAT, Parent Surveys, Student Engagement Surveys, Accountability Pillar data, etc.), the areas of greatest need for our students became evident and those areas became our school goals. Please note that while we prioritize our efforts on three school goals per year, countless other aspects of a successful school continue to occur each and every day. Below are the Hill Crest Community school goals for the upcoming school year.

School Goal 1: Improve students' reading comprehension by 3% as measured by the Canadian Achievement Tests (CAT) (comparative to 2016-2017 results).

Reading continues to be at the forefront of our efforts. Many of our students are very good technical readers; however, they struggle when asked questions about the text they've read.

As a staff, we have a list of comprehension strategies that allow students to deeply understand the text they're reading; however, your help to accomplish this goal would be greatly appreciated. Through the course of the year, you can expect to receive some strategies from us that you can use when reading with your child. In addition to reading which your child, one of the most important strategies is to question your child on the stories they read; that way you can tell if they're understanding the text.

School Goal 2: Improve students' writing abilities by 5% from the beginning of the year, as measured by the FVSD division writing samples using the division created rubric.

Writing is another area where our students can improve. This is a long term goal and improving a student's writing ability doesn't happen overnight. Just like reading, staff have identified strategies that they will implement to improve student writing. As a school, we saw some growth in writing last year and we're hoping to continue this trend.

School Goal 3: Increase student engagement levels as measured by the "Interested and Motivated" category of the Our School Survey from 16% to 27%.

At Hill Crest, we want all students to value their education and we want them to be curious, to think critically, and to make informed decisions. To instill the value of education in our students we need to ensure they see a purpose in what they do.

This goal will be emphasized primarily in Junior High due to low engagement scores in the past; however, it's important that our younger students genuinely value their learning as well. We will continue to focus on engagement practices in class and offer a variety of extracurricular activities for all students.

STUDENT MARKS AVAILABLE TO PARENTS

Parents are able to view their child's marks by accessing a specific website. After teachers have entered marks for a particular assignment or test, parents have the ability to see how their child did by accessing the parent portal. If this is something that interests you as a parent, you will need to sign up in the office for any of your children attending HCCS. This is available for grades 4-12 students. Students attending LCPS will have to sign up at the LCPS office.

STUDENT MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

Although the Fort Vermilion School Division believes that the responsibility for the administration of medicine does not lie with the school system, it also recognizes that from time to time there may be times that school staff need to administer medication. Parents, it is extremely important that you advise the school of any medical issues your child has. A written request, using the appropriate FVSD form, must note the specific time the medication is to be administered, the exact dosage, and the duration of the treatment. All medication provided must be in the original container. The safety of all students is one of our highest priorities and prescription medicine will not be administered to students unless the above noted conditions are met.

SCHOOL AUTOMATED CALL OUT (SCHOOL MESSENGER)

Our school will once again be using the automated school messenger program as one of the forms of communicating with parents. Paper notices will still go home as usual. School messenger is also used for our Safe Arrival Program, where if your child is absent and the school doesn't know why before 9:30 you will receive a phone call.

SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

As a means of keeping students safe & cared for, the school has established a "Safe Arrival" program. In essence, the purpose of this program is to ensure that when you send your students out the door in the morning that they arrive safely at school.

This will be accomplished by having parents notify us of student absences in advance. We request that parents notify the school with a brief phone call or note in your child's agenda whenever a child is going to be absent from school. We have voice mail so you can leave a message even if it's early in the morning or late at night. If we don't receive notification from you and your child is absent, school messenger will call you at 9:30am so you are aware of your child's absence. When parents receive this phone call they should call the school and let the office know that their children are not in school. We need to know if they are out sick or if they will be away for several days. Knowing why students are absent will help us understand trends and respond better to situations of communicable illnesses.

HOT LUNCH PROGRAM

There will be a hot lunch available at school every week this year. We are making every effort to provide healthy lunch choices that our students will enjoy. If you would like to volunteer to assist with hot lunch, please contact the school or fill out the volunteer form attached to this newsletter.

Students who have ordered but are absent on hot lunch day will be reimbursed. Parents will order hot lunch one month at a time. All orders for children in one family will be made on one order form. Payment for the month will be due before the first hot lunch of that month. Hot lunch items are also set up in <http://schoolcashionline.com> if you prefer to pay online.
